PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

Happy New Year to all our playing members, Vice Presidents and Supporters including the parents that bring their children along on a Sunday. We extend a warm East Kent welcome to Old Alleynians RFC and we hope you initially enjoy the afternoon and our hospitality and then experience some attractive rugby. A Cracking end to the year and the beginning of a New Year, as both the men's senior teams opened with a win, the 1st XV against Sidcup 2nds (away) and the 2nds against Dover (home) Regrettably our next game was cancelled by the opposition (Dartford Valley RFC) who couldn't manage to field a team, which is always a shame. I hope it's not terminal, and of course we had another regrettable situation, losing to Medway last week.

Today our Counties 2 Kent League game sees Old Alleynians placed in 6th position in the League with 8 wins from 15 starts this season. They have an interesting statistic in that they score on average 28 points per game and concede 27 points, so today could be a high scoring competitive match.

The last three 1st team games have been played in very poor, heavy conditions. At Maidstone, the last game of December was played under what racing pundits would consider "heavy going" while the previous week at Sidcup the conditions were described as "sticky" so the pitch at St Peters may serve in Thanet's favour this week as a home advantage.

The heavy going may suit some players and Maidstone nominated Finley "Finbar" White as our Man of the Match. He scored early on and then beavered away for the rest of the game. The previous week he scored two tries, but regrettably he will not be available for the rest of the season as he has returned to active duty. Another of his Marine comrades, Sonny Teall, made a brief appearance in the Sidcup game before tweaking his hamstring. Both of these players will be missed as they have returned to serve King & Country. Gil Smith made his 1st XV debut against Sidcup replacing his polar opposite in age Danny Clements. This was also true of Lettsy who was replaced by Dennis Davies.

What needs to be said here is that all the above mentioned new talent has been home grown and has come up through the ranks of our minis and junior sections and they show the hard work put in by junior coaches and parents. The players are starting to pay dividends for all that earlier effort. When players are asked to "Dig Deep" and show strength of character, all of which was required in both the Maidstone and Sidcup games, I believe, it's a "state of mind" that home grown players show that brings out the best in them over 80 minutes. Much the same was true of the 1997 Thanet winning team at Twickenham in the inaugural Intermediate Cup. In both their semi-final and quarter-final in that competition Thanet were losing right up into the last quarter of the game, but they showed true grit to win both matches in extra time! This is where the saying "It's not over till we say its over!" comes from and this mantra is now written in large letters in the corridor adjacent to the 1st XV changing room.





MEDWAY RFC 2S 13 - 7 THANET WANDERERS RUFC

A few regular faces were missing from Thanet's squad with Charlie Bailey moving to number eight in the absence of both Finn White and Ben Cannon. Leon Doody was at scrum half with brother Callum not available. Second team captain, Tom Stevens stepped up to the senior side for the first time this season and Ewan Maclean was on the other wing. Thirty-eight players have now represented Wanderers this season in the fifteen league matches played. Thanet remained in second place after this defeat and Medway are in eighth.

It was a grey, windless, cold afternoon as Wanderers kicked off against a Medway side who were clearly up for a contest. Two early penalties for high tackles put them on the front foot but Wanderers withstood the early onslaught before a penalty from Adam Harrison cleared the danger. Medway opened the scoring after nine minutes when a penalty opportunity from in front and 30 metres out was converted for a 3-0 lead. Thanet quickly responded with a promising attack that broke down after a knock-on but penalties to both sides made for a stop-start encounter. On sixteen minutes played Wanderers' ten, Adam Harrison surged through a gap and was stopped just short of the line but reset the attack left. Thanet's second row, Andy Letts received and executed a lovely dummy, that would please any three-quarter, before touching down unchallenged. Lewis Downer added the extras and Wanderers led 7-3 after twenty minutes. Eight minutes later a long and deep penalty from Medway's kicker set them on Wanderers 22. The visitors did not defend well against a bustling driving attack that grew from a line out on Thanet's 22, leading to a Medway try ten metres left of Wanderers' posts. The conversion opened up a 10-7 lead. Wanderers had the opportunity to level things up a minute later but Downer's kick slipped by the left post. Play went from end

to end but neither side could break through, Maclean made an important tackle as Medway looked likely to score but play was fragmented. Wanderers were warned for too many high tackles and it was the hosts who looked the more likely to score in the run-up to halftime.

Thanet's coaches will have been concerned with the number of first-up tackles missed in the first half and would certainly have been hoping for more urgency from the side in the second half. A powerful carry from James Crompton set the right tone and Leon Doody's testing kick led to a spilt ball and set a good position for the scrum. A penalty set Wanderers close at a line out and a determined drive for the line was held up. A good chance went begging with the line at their mercy and finally Medway were able to clear the danger. During a brief excursion into Wanderers' half, Medway took the points when Thanet offended to extend their lead to 13-7. With half an hour remaining Wanderers rang the changes from the bench with Maclean taking a break to be replaced by Finley Hickmott with Mike Whitehead and Lenny Brown also taking to to the field in place of Andy Letts and Danny Clement. Brown was quick to make his presence felt with a charge down that deserved a better outcome. Thanet were now in control with dominance of territory and possession but the hosts remained firmly in control of their line. Opportunities for points from the kicking tee were passed over in favour of moves to cross the white line but the home side repelled every attempt on their line. Congratulations to Medway on a great defensive effort that made for compelling and entertaining viewing. Wanderers played much better in the second half but their usual cohesion and invention were absent today and the hosts were deserving winners of a sporting contest.

THANET WANDERERS RUFC 12-7 MAIDSTONE RFC

 $\mbox{\it Hard-won}$ victory for the Wanderers in the county town.

In their final match of 2024, Wanderers had to produce another top defensive performance to hang on to an early lead and retain second place in Counties 2 Kent league. Thanet made just one change to the pack that started last week's fixture against Vigo, with Noah Dann in at loosehead. It was almost all change in the backs with only number 12, Lewis Downer lining up in the same position as in last week's defeat of Vigo. Regular scrum-half Callum Doody again moved to ten in the absence of joint vice-captain Adam Harrison with brother Leon in at nine. Andrew Dolan played on the right wing with Finley Hickmott, usually a back-row forward, on the other. Joint vice-captain Henry Mirams moved from full-back to outside centre with Ewan Maclean replacing him at fullback.

Wanderers kicked off with a strong breeze at their back and made a dream start. Dolan broke well and handed on to number eight Finn White who made an assured finish. A quality conversion from Downer meant the visitors led 7-0 with two minutes played. A couple of minutes later Maidstone touched down under the posts, at the other end following a strong attack. 7-7 after five minutes, indicated that an open running game could be on the way but it was not to be. Wanderers' attacks were undermined when penalties were conceded including two for crossing. After 23 minutes Callum Doody, whose kicking from hand was excellent throughout the match, set a good attacking position from a penalty. Wanderers line-out generally functioned well today and

White was soon ghosting through the home defence to initiate some lovely handling along the line that ended with Maclean scoring his maiden first XV try. No conversion, but the Wanderers led 12-7 with an hour remaining. The remainder of the first period was littered with penalties, particularly for not releasing, which led to a stop-start encounter.

Charlie Bailey left the bench for the second half as Dennis Davies took a break from the second row. Maidstone were marched back another ten metres when comment was passed on the decision for the penalty by today's referee who made every effort to explain his decisions to the players. Danny Clement and Michael Whitehead joined from the bench to reinforce the Wanderers' defence which was really tested during the second period. It was not the most inspiring fare for the festive period but the Wanderers' defence again earned plaudits from the limited travelling support. There was no further score and the Wanderers took a hardearned four points whilst the hosts took a wellearned losing bonus point.

There was a real captain's performance from hooker Warren Riddell-Bloomfield today, Callum Doody's kicking from hand was very valuable Wanderers' and another of Thanet's growing band of talented youngsters, Dom Springer was Wanderers' Coaches man of the match after another excellent performance from the young prop-forward both at scrumtime and in the loose.

For Thanet, Danny Clement started at loosehead with fellow Vet Andy Letts in the second row. Charlie Bailey partnered him in the engine room with Dom Springer at tight-head. Joint vice-captain Adam Harrison was back at Ten with Louis Marshall at inside centre in place of the injured Lewis Downer. Charlie Panteli, who usually plays at Ten, was at full-back and flank forward Finley Hickmott continued on the left wing in a re-jigged backline. After today's league matches Wanderers hold on to second place but Sidcup slipped a place to fifth but with a game in hand.

The pitch was sticky but playable and the weather was not as fearsome as forecast. Wanderers kicked off on a still afternoon and the hosts were soon scrambling to plug holes in their defence. After four minutes, Wanderers went ahead when Finn White led an onslaught that ended with him scoring under the posts. The conversion attempt was charged down but Thanet led 5-0. The hosts quickly responded and Harrison's long clearance to halfway eased some Sidcup pressure. Five minutes later Harrison again sent a penalty to 22 metres out and the line out that followed ended with a spectacular drive from Wanderers' pack that snaked its way to the line before White again claimed the touchdown. Panteli's conversion was good to make it 12-0 and he added another three points when converting a penalty attempt minutes late for a 15-0 lead. Harrison demonstrated some soccer skills as he led a dribble deep into the opposition half but the move ended with Wanderers conceding a penalty. Charlie Bailey was having a dominant day at the line-outs and was moving well in the loose. Henry Mirams' tackle ended a dangerous break-out and Andy Letts was also soon showing his tackling prowess. Thanet interfered at a line-out allowing the hosts to set good field position and mount an end-of-half attack but Wanderers stood firm. White led another attack to end the siege but Wanderers were again penalised when in a good

attacking position. The hosts put the ball out of play to end a good opening half for the Wanderers.

Gil Smith made a very satisfactory First XV debut after leaving the bench to replace Clement for the second half. Thanet started the second well but were penalised for crossing and Dennis Davies replaced Letts in the second row, After an unsuccessful attempt from near the 10-metre line, just a few minutes later from around 24 metres. Panteli put Wanderers 18-0 ahead. With around a quarter of the game remaining Sidcup made the most of two penalties to set good attacking positions and Wanderers were forced to scramble to touch down in the in-goal area. Captain Warren Riddell-Bloomfield at hooker, with flank forwards James Crompton and Brett Scott needed all their experience in the battle to keep their line intact. The hosts were determined not to leave pointless and showed great resilience as they battered away at Wanderers hard tackling defence and with minutes remaining a little chip through was touched down in the corner. There was no conversion and no further points were added so the final score was a win for Wanderers by 18-5.

Wanderers' Coaches can be happy with this performance with preparation time severely curtailed by the Christmas and New Year break. Callum Doody and Adam Harrison's half-back partnership continues to blossom and it's great to see Andy Dolan returning to good form. Sadly there was only a brief glimpse of Sonny Teall from the bench before he had to withdraw with a tweaked hamstring. Louis Marshall also again sustained injury and had to withdraw early. Skipper Warren Riddell Bloomfield has worked hard on his throwing in to the lineout after moving from the back row to play at hooker. His partnership with young second-row Charlie Bailey is flourishing and paying dividends in terms of possession. Charlie had a top game today and was a popular choice as Wanderers' man of the match after another fine game.

Six tries in a sparkling second half put Wanderers back on the winning way.

It was good to see Nick Herbert back at outside centre for his season's debut and Adam Harrison returned at Ten after a week away. Callum Doody reclaimed the Scrum Half jersey from brother Leon. Vigo were bottom of the league as the game kicked off but their only win was against Folkestone who defeated Wanderers in their most recent match at St Peters. No results can be taken as read in the Counties 2 Kent League.

A strong wind was behind Vigo as they kicked off up the slope on a bright cold day. An early penalty set Wanderers deep in Vigo's half and some quality rucking took Wanderers over for a try for Number 8 Finlay White within the first four minutes. Lewis Downer made an excellent conversion and Wanderers led 7-0. Dennis Davies made a good catch and attacked back strongly from the restart but the attack could not be maintained. Gradually Vigo worked their way back into the game and put the Wanderers' defence under continual pressure but, despite conceding penalties, the line remained firm. Referee Mark Shaw showed yellow to fullback Henry Mirams as the team went down to fourteen for ten minutes. With about ten minutes of the half remaining, Vigo wisely went for the posts and were on the board 7-3. A rare Wanderers attack, minutes later, brought a penalty and Downer restored the seven-point margin. Nick Herbert made an important trade mark big saving tackle and the Wanderers would have been happy to reach half-time without conceding again against a team who had looked anything but bottom of the league.

Playing up the slope with the wind behind them in the second half, there was a real transformation about Thanet with no one more fired up than left-winger Louis Marshall. Leading the onslaught he rampaged through the Vigo defence leaving defenders in his wake to touch down under the posts with the half just a

couple of minutes old. Downer added the extras for a 17-3 lead. Five minutes later more insistent pressure from the Wanderers with some top-drawer handling on all fronts was ended by Tom O'Callaghan racing in to touch down. There was no conversion leaving the score at 22-3. The young winger, who more regularly plays at scrum half was again touching down three minutes later. Receiving near the right wing following a wide-ranging attack that had begun near halfway, he picked an elusive line on his way to the posts to secure the try bonus point.

Downer's conversion put Thanet 29-3 ahead. Was that match over? The message hadn't reached Vigo who worked hard as they sought to break the home defensive line and were eventually rewarded with a try wide out near the left corner that could not be converted. Wanderers quickly responded with a restart that found a long touch and was in a good attacking position. With possession regained Wanderers worked their way into midfield and Louis Marshall was again the scorer under the posts making the score, after Downer's conversion, 36-5. With 25 minutes remaining a big score looked likely but the visitors' stubborn defence meant it was seventeen minutes before the next try was registered and that completed Louis Marshall's hat-trick. There was no way to stop him as he finished some lovely flowing rugby to triumphantly touch down. A mislaid kicking tee meant Downer had to rush his attempted conversion and it rebounded from a post. Two minutes later it was required again after Nick Herbert capped a very successful return with a strongly finished try. Downer added the extras making the final score 48-8 to Wanderers.

Great defence in the first half maintained the Wanderers' narrow lead until the break and allowed the Thanet side's fitness and stamina to build a substantial score during the second half against a whole-hearted Vigo team. Good luck to them as they battle to move up the table during the early months of 2025.

Wanderers remain in second place in the league, with the third team, Gillingham Anchorians, hard on their heels and just a point behind them. Next week, Thanet travel to Maidstone, who are in eleventh place in the twelve-team league. However, the Wanderers squad and their coaches will not be complacent. Please support the team if you can.

Head Coach, Elliot Blackmore thanked James Crompton who played at six for another top performance and congratulated secondrow young Charlie Bailey on another 'make a difference 'performance from the bench. Wanderers' stand-in Number Eight, Finn White, has come through the ranks of the club's juniors to give very mature performances in the first XV. He gave an outstanding display against Vigo, standing big in defence and carrying strongly to make many metres. He scored a try and was chosen by the opposition and his own coaches as Wanderers' man of the match.

THANET WANDERERS U15s VS ASHFORD U15s MATCH REPORT

Sunday the 19th brought cold, but very playable conditions for Thanet U15s visit to Aylesford Bulls, the 4th league match of this season's campaign. Aylesford came into the match having won 1 and lost two, whilst Thanet were unbeaten at the top of the table having won their first 3 games, with the bonus of only having conceded 14 points across those matches.

Thanet won the toss and decided to kick off. One of Finlay Smith's trademark high kicks was enthusiastically chased by Dexter Sproates and he was unlucky to knock on attempting the catch. An Aylesford scrum followed and some fast line speed from the Thanet centres saw Aylesford fumble and at the resulting ruck Thanet gained possession and the forwards gained vital yards before the ball went along the backs where Robbie Jones made vital yards before being tackled just before the line. Gab Petrauskas was the first forward to the breakdown and Harrison Tickle popped the ball to him to drive over the line for Thanet's first try of the game. The ever-reliable boot of Finlay Smith saw the conversion sail between the posts and Thanet were leading 7-0 within the first 6 minutes of the game.

From the restart an Aylesford high tackle on the halfway line allowed Finlay to kick deep into the Aylesford half. From the resulting line out the ball was on its way along the line when Aylesford intercepted. The ball was regained at the ruck and again two phases of forward play dragged in the Aylesford defence and Finlay made 15 yards before passing to Robbie Jones on the wing who had a relatively easy run in from 10 meters out. Another conversion for Finlay Smith and the Thanet lead increased to 14-0 with 9 minutes gone.

What followed was a period of sustained pressure that saw Thanet camped in Aylesford half. What was evident during this period was the understanding that the players now have together and the game management that the half back pairing of Smith and Tickle are now

starting to impress upon proceedings. No longer are we seeing a rush to take the tap penalty or a player trying to make the impossible pass but a new calmness about play that is bringing a much more mature style of rugby that opposition teams are struggling to compete with.

From open play around the halfway line, the ball makes its way to Gab who managed to find his way through the heart of the Aylesford defence and it was only desperate defence that managed to hold him up over the line. The resulting dropout was miscued and dropped straight into the arms of Jamie Barbara who had the simple task of running the ball in. The conversion was missed and Thanet now led 19-0.

The half time whistle blew, and Thanet had a well-deserved lead of 19-0. With a full bench and a good lead, it was time for changes and all 7 subs came on for the second half. A concerning few minutes for Milo Whitehead who suffered a knock to the head seconds before half time. A suspected concussion and he will be following the return to play protocol. We wish him well.

It took Thanet a good ten minutes to get used to the new line up during which time Aylesford enjoyed a good period of possession and pushed Thanet back into their 22. The pressure was relieved when Finlay Smith spotted a gap and raced through it to reach the halfway line. Good defence play by Aylesford managed to stop the attack, but the ball was spun out to Andrew Bull who taking the ball at pace stepped 3 players from the 22 and scored under the posts. The conversion hit the post and Thanet were now leading 24-0.

What followed was a 10-minute period that was dominated by the referee's whistle with both sides making errors and conceding penalties. Much of this period was played around the halfway line. For a moment the game seemed to stagnate.

A good kick out of defence by Finlay Smith saw the ball reaching the oppositions 22 and good chasing saw Thanet retrieve possession. Again, the forwards took control for several phases. Space appeared on the Aylesford left, which was quickly spotted, and Jack Sperryn passed to Finlay Smith who popped the ball to Andrew Bull running a tight line from deep which gave him the momentum to drag his tackler over the line for his second try of the game. A successful conversion made the score 31-0.

Play was now permanently in the Aylesford half and from a scrum on their 22 Finlay threw a long double miss pass which Rio Goddard gathered well and rounded his opposite number to put the ball down under the posts. Yet another conversion from Finlay saw the score move to 38-0.

With just 3 minutes to go some scrappy play allows Dexter Sproates to pick up the ball and start a run of 25 yards which was only stopped

by some desperate Aylesford defence. Dexter managed to basketball pass the ball over the defender's head to Finlay Smith who supported well and then ran in under the posts for the final try of the game. Finlay converts yet again and the full-time score rises to 45-0.

The win makes its 4 from 4 for the U15s with the bonus of still only conceding 14 points across the 4 games. The interplay between the forwards and the backs was one of Thanet's strengths throughout the game and their defensive line speed never allowed Aylesford to escape their half for much of the match.
